#### **Principal's Report**

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

#### **Twilight markets**

What a fabulous evening we had on Friday,3<sup>rd</sup> November for our P&C Twilight Markets. The weather did not look friendly during the day, but the sun shone and the wind died down to give us a perfect spring evening. Congratulations to the P&C, particularly the Twilight Markets sub-committee for great organisation and preparation for this event. We had many visitors to our school community on the evening who commented to me on the beautiful community feel in our school. I am very proud of our school and community for the effort and cooperation that went into such a successful event.

#### **Springwood High School Presentation Night**

On Tuesday night, I had the privilege to attend the 50<sup>th</sup> Springwood High School Presentation night. There were many awards presented to our past students and many family names I recognised from our school. It is always timely to be reminded of where our Faulconbridge students are heading in the future and the amazing opportunities that the local comprehensive high school can offer our students.

#### **Mid Mountains Learning Community**

The Principals of the Mid Mountains Schools met together last week with representatives of the Blue Mountains Aboriginal Education Consultative Group (AECG) to discuss our plans for Aboriginal Education in the mountains. This includes building our understanding of Aboriginal culture, histories and languages for all students. At Faulconbridge Public School we will be working to develop a Reconciliation Action Plan within our next school plan 2018-2020, and to develop our understanding of custodianship and our totem, the glossy black cockatoo.

#### **PULSE** concert

I am looking forward to attending the PULSE concert this evening at the Sydney Opera House. I know the PULSE choir students and our PULSE dance student, Chloe Schofield have been rehearsing and preparing for this evening performance. Thank you to Miss Theoharis for her continued dedication to the choir activities in our school. A big thank you to the parents who commit time and energy to the additional rehearsals. I am sure it will be another fabulous evening of entertainment, and a very special experience for our students who are performing.

#### 2018 Organisation

To assist us with planning for 2018, it helpful to know the number of students anticipated at our school. Reasonably accurate student numbers are required to assist our planning processes for next year. The number of students affects class structures, staffing requirements and the school budget. If you know you will be moving out of the area, please notify the school office ASAP. Likewise, if you know of a new family moving into the area, please ask them visit our school to get an enrolment form.

#### **Emergency drill**

We had our planned emergency evacuation drill last Wednesday. It went every well and even included our transition Kindy students for 2018. All students moved sensibly to our evacuation point and everybody was accounted for. These drills are important requirement of our Workplace Health and Safety (WHS) plan. After each drill the WHS team review our procedures and discuss any issues or changes with staff. When we do a drill, we will let you know through our Website, E-News App and Facebook page. We also inform the local police that this is a drill.

#### **Playground issues**

We have had some issues recently with missing hats, jackets and food missing from lunch boxes. Teachers are following up with issues as they are raised. We ask for your partnership and support in dealing with these issues through open communication, and reinforcement of values and expectations. We are addressing the issues of missing items, both individually and collectively, using our PBL structures with a focus on the PBL expectation of **Respect people and property.** As an incentive teachers will be giving cub awards for students who are taking care of their own property and not moving items that do not belong to them. Names written in jackets and hats, and on other items also help us to quickly return property to the rightful owner.

The Toilet area is an area where issues have arisen recently. Some damage is occurring, and we are currently trying to pinpoint the source of the problem. Again, we ask for your help in curbing inappropriate behaviour by reinforcing positive values and appropriate behaviour.

Our PBL expectations for the toilets are:

Safe:	Flush, wash and leave			
	Walk in these areas			
	Be sensible with water			
Respectful:	Wait your turn			
	Give others privacy			
	Turn off taps			
Learners:	Return promptly to class or playground			
	Report problems to teachers			

If issues arise for your student at school, please speak to your child's class teacher first. It is always best to make an appointment to see or speak to the teacher, so they can give full attention to the issue. We have fair processes and procedures which help us to investigate and resolve issues. If the issue is regarding behaviour, teachers are in the best position to reinforce our PBL values of safe, respectful learners. If there is an issue with another student, please do not approach and speak to that child. Again, it is best to contact the class teacher or stage supervisor, explain the situation and trust that we will follow our processes and procedures to resolve the issue. Your cooperation in this matter is appreciated.






















## Our Students at the 2017 Celebration Sing Out Concert




