Principal's Report

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Staffing changes

Over recent years our school has had some teaching positions filled by teachers as temporary appointments. They are on a contract for up to one school year. Under Department of Education staffing guidelines these positions can only be filled for a period of up to one school year at a time. Last year, these positions were filled through an Expression of Interest process to those staff who regularly worked in our school. This year the process was repeated with a wider range of applicants from across the state and interstate. We had many applications, and through a rigorous selection process new staff have been chosen to work at our school.

This means that Miss Kidd and Miss Paull will be leaving Faulconbridge PS at the end of 2018. I would like to thank them both for their contribution to our school over the last couple of years. Both teachers are well loved by the students and the community, and I know they will be missed. I'm sure you will join me in wishing them well for 2019 and beyond.

It is unfortunate at times that protocols for announcing changes are not followed. This does not allow for procedural fairness in these matters to occur. I have been made aware of social media posts that have publicly announced these changes before the school community could be informed through our formal communication streams of the newsletter and the school website. I am disappointed that this has occurred as important announcements will always be made through our school newsletter and website to the whole school community.

Community Consultation

Thank you to all those who attended the community consultation meeting last Monday night. I would like to thank all those who attended for their high level of engagement in issues which affect our school.

One of the topics covered was that of Ethics classes at Faulconbridge. Currently due to a lack of trained teachers we are placing Ethics classes on hold for Semester 1. This will allow volunteers to complete the training and all the administrative procedures involved. This decision may be reviewed if we have enough trained volunteers to meet the demand for classes. Thank you to Abbey Howells, our current Ethics Coordinator for attending the meeting to share her knowledge with the community.

Another topic that was discussed is the issue of pedestrian safety and parking near our school. We are very much aware that parking options are limited. We are currently in conversation with Blue Mountains City Council about options to alleviate the situation. There is a website link included. Our local Police officers have also been involved in raising awareness of safety concerns when parking or stopping in no stopping areas. Of particular concern is stopping on the crossing to allow children to get out of the car. Parking on footpaths or grass verges also places our students at risk if they need to move onto the road to get past parked cars. While I understand that the parking options close to the school are limited, it is safer to park and walk a little further. Ultimately the safety of all our students is paramount. Please take note of the signage and follow the road rules.

Springwood High School Parent Maths workshop

On Thursday night Mrs Jansons, Mrs Carter, Mrs Harrison and myself worked with Springwood HS staff to present a parent maths workshop for Stage 3 and Stage 4 (Years 5-8) students. This initiative is part of our community team planning to build stronger links with Springwood High School. It helps us to build our focus on learning and the continuity of learning that happens from Stage 3 to Stage 4. The workshop was very "hands on" with lots of opportunities for parents to try the strategies we teach to build understanding of mathematics concepts. We hope to able to offer further opportunities in 2019.

Prefect Selection

On Monday our Year 5 nominees for school leadership presented their speeches to the rest of the school. I was very impressed by the high calibre of their presentations. They all spoke with calm and poise, and with little evidence of the nerves I know they were all feeling. Everyone has commented to me on the high standard set by these students. Regardless of the outcome this team of students will be fantastic to work with next year. Following the speeches, students returned to their classes to vote. Votes have been tallied and our school leaders for 2019 will be announced at the Celebration of Student Achievement next Wednesday 12th December.

This is an important moment for these students and it is character building. There were 21 nominees, and only 8 will be in the leadership team. I have reminded them all that this process is about their peers selecting the leaders. It is not about friendships and it is not about popularity. I would like to thank those parents of the nominees who have let the students undertake this process without interfering. It can be a fine line between supporting your child through challenges and interfering in a school process that has been reviewed to ensure equity and fairness to all participants. I have heard of other schools where students and parents actively campaign for votes. Thankfully, our processes allow all students the opportunity to participate with the same level of support provided to each nominee.
