Principal's Report

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Swimming Carnival

We were blessed with fine weather for our Swimming Carnival at Lawson Pool last Thursday. I was impressed by not only the competitive spirit, but also the 'have a go' attitude of our students. Sportsmanship was definitely on display, and the students were safe and respectful throughout the day.

A big thankyou to the Stage 3 teachers who organised the carnival. It was a great job team!

Meet the Teacher Evening

A big thank you to all the parents who came along to our Meet the Teacher evening and BBQ. It was a great opportunity to find out what is happening at school, especially in your child's classroom.

A big thank you to Mr Earl, Mrs Jansons and the staff for organising and cooking the BBQ, and to all the staff for their effort and preparation for the evening. It was a positive event for our school community. A reminder that any students attending after school activities such as dancing remain the responsibility of parents and there is no teacher supervision. All children including siblings should be under the supervision of their parents.

A quick question was asked at the Meet the Teacher evening: In an effort to improve our communication between home and school, would you be willing to attend a Community Communication Meeting, two Monday evenings per term?

The response was approximately 50% yes and 50% no, so we will organise our first community communication meeting soon. Keep an eye on the next newsletter for a date and time.

Volunteer Induction

Thank you to all our helpers in the school who attended the Volunteer Induction on Thursday morning. It covered a safety briefing & emergency procedures, sign in/out procedures, child protection, WWCC requirements, contact people, first aid, student supervision and duty of care. It is good to know that we can keep everyone safe in an emergency and that we have met all our Child Protection and Working with Children Check rules. It is important to sign in and sign out so we know exactly who is on our school site at any given time. **An additional induction session will be held on Monday 12th March at 7pm** for those parents who were unable to attend the morning session.

If you are considering helping in the classroom or the school, as **parent volunteer** (parent or close relative) you must complete the Appendix 5 Declaration form and provide 100 points of proof identity to the front office. These documents should be provided prior to commencing volunteer work. The school then needs to complete their processes, with completed Appendix 5 forms and 100 points proof of identity documentation securely filed and our school register updated. These documents are auditable and must be current at all times. Please assist the office staff by completing these forms and providing 100 points proof of identity documentation.

Non-parent volunteers require a Working with Children Check, 100 points of proof of identity and completion of Appendix 11. Working with Children Checks can be applied for on the Roads and Maritime (RMS) website.

Compliance with DoE policies

There are some changes to the way things are being done to ensure compliance with DoE policies. Some of these changes may feel uncomfortable at first, but we need to meet our legislative obligations to the students, their welfare and safety. Much of the change is administrative, but there will be some procedural differences.

Principal's Report Continued...

In particular the **Carpark**. There has been a safety briefing issued by Workplace Health and Safety regarding school carparks *'It is recognised that vehicles enter school grounds for a range of reasons, including car parking, deliveries and contractors accessing equipment on site, undertaking maintenance and repairs or enabling access for students with disabilities. While we work through any required changes to current policy and procedures, principals are reminded to think carefully about the access that vehicles have into and around their school grounds and ensure all reasonable strategies and processes are in place to minimise the risk of injury and incidents, particularly in areas of the school where staff, students and members of the school community frequent.'*

In the last newsletter I requested that parents and volunteers did not use the carpark due to safety concerns. This was reiterated on Monday night at the P&C meeting. The Department of Education is currently reviewing its policy on school carparks following the horrific accident last year in a Western Sydney school which resulted in two children losing their lives. The school carpark is not a thoroughfare, nor is it a drop off and pick up zone. As such I again request that parents and volunteers do not use it. This is a safety request. When the Department of Education has released a policy update I will inform the community. In the interim please respect this request for the safety of all.

External Providers of Therapy Services

There is now a policy for the provision of external services within school hours. We will be updating our processes over the next few weeks. The key features are that parents must provide a written request to the school/principal for the service, therapists must also complete an induction process, and planning meetings with parents, school and therapists must occur and records kept. All therapists entering the school are at the principal's discretion. Disruption to learning, conflicts of interest and confidentiality must be considered when providing access for therapists. All parents of students currently accessing therapy services at school will be contacted in the next few weeks to update our records.

Notes home

A booklet of permission notes for various programs and processes has been distributed this week for the 2018 school year. It includes permission for child protection lessons, internet policy, and permission to publish among others. Please read and sign all relevant notes and **return the booklet** to the front office by **Friday 9th March**.

Emergency Bushfire Drill

An Emergency Bushfire drill was conducted on Friday of Week 2. All students and visitors moved to the hall quickly and sensibly. Our WHS team will evaluate our procedures and identify improvements that can be made. Another drill will occur soon where we combine with KU to seek shelter in the school hall as our school is their emergency evacuation point.

School Planning: Developing our future vision

In developing our future vision for our school, we wanted to hear from you. There was an opportunity last year to come along and share ideas. As this opportunity was not widely attended, I asked people to take a moment to get creative and provide us with your vision for the next three years. We received 2 newspaper headlines from the community. Students in Stage 3 also participated in this process and identified areas to work on including wellbeing and learning. The staff have worked intensively on building a shared vision by examining values and beliefs about learning.

Our school vision for 2018-2020 is:

Learning to live in a safe engaging environment, inspiring innovative learners and positive growth for all.

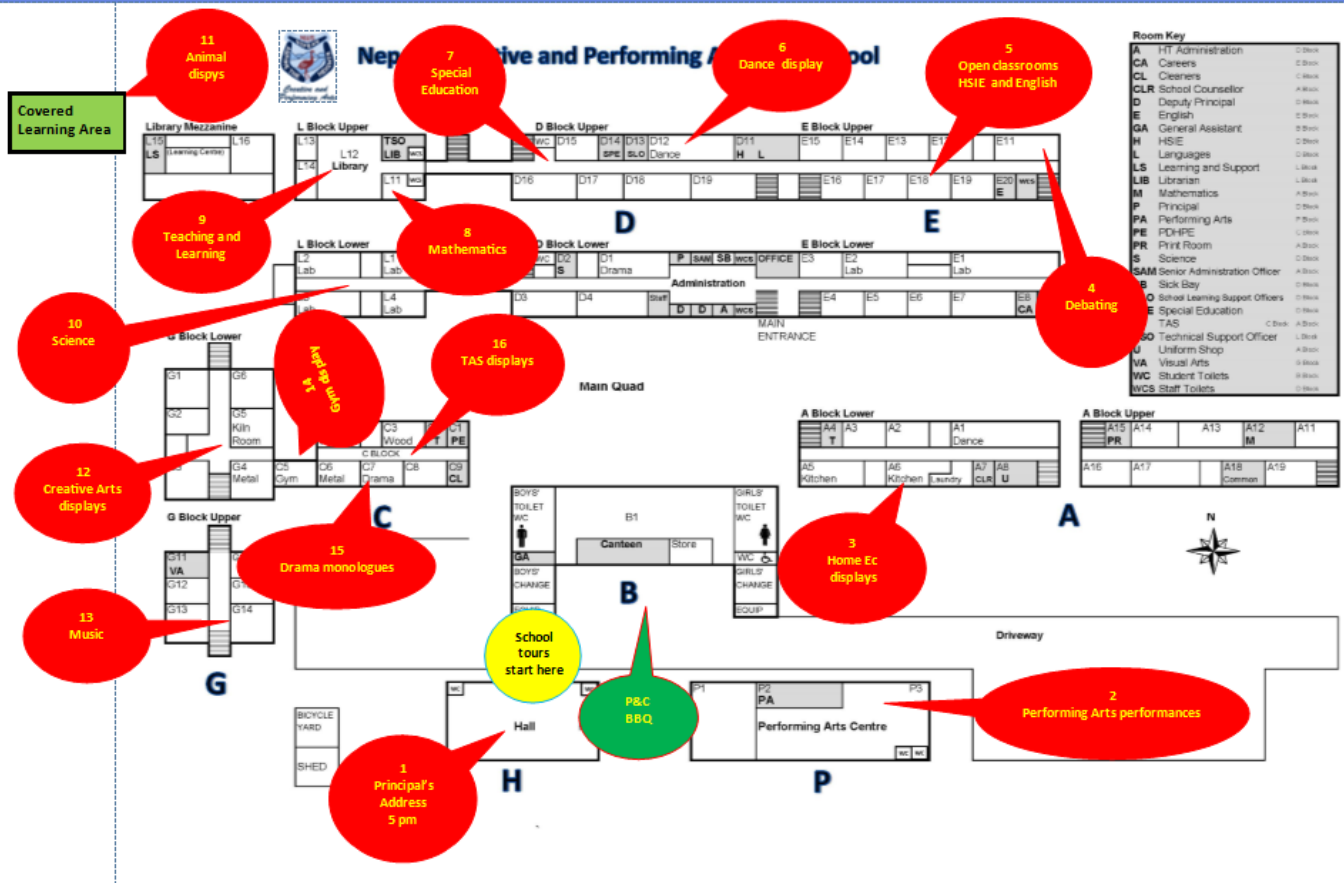

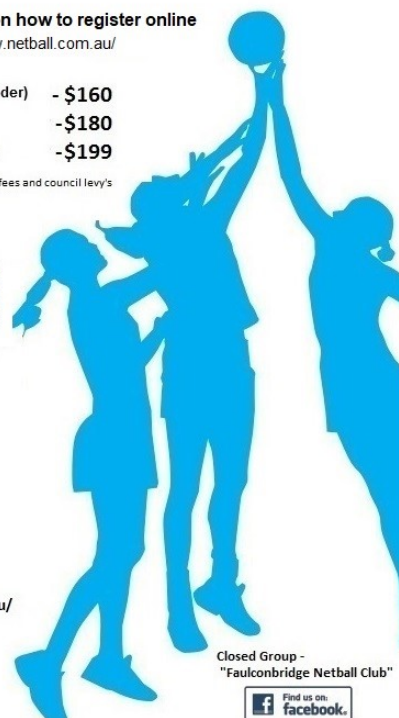

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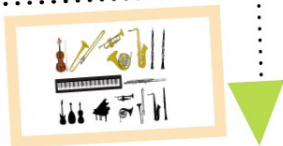

Training Orchestra

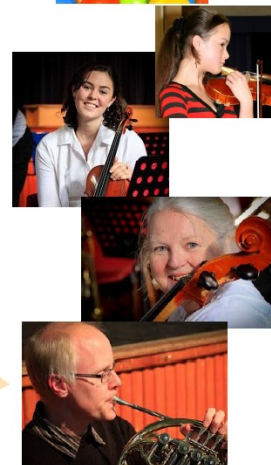
The training orchestra caters for players of all ages who are learning an orchestral instrument.
