Principal's Report

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Dance Festival

What a busy few weeks our dance groups have had, culminating in the matinee and evening performances last Wednesday at the Joan Sutherland Performing Arts Centre in Penrith.

Stage 1 dance group performed 'Rainbow' from the song by Sia.

Stage 2 dance group performed 'Break Free' to the song "Fasta" by Kah-Lo

Stage 3 dance group performed 'A Touch of Magic' to a compilation of music from the Harry Potter and Fantastic Beasts soundtracks.

All the performances were a very entertaining, and I'm sure everyone, including the teachers were very tired at the end of the night. Well done to all involved.

'Dress as a Farmer' day.

Thank you to everyone who came to school dressed as a farmer and donated to the drought relief fundraising. We raised \$1469.10 last Thursday. KU Preschool joined in the fun on the day and raised \$150.80. Together we will be sending \$1619.90 to Quambone PS.

A huge thank you to Caitlin, Grace, Scarlett and Tegan (and their families) for their initiative in planning the day, organising and running the activities.

- Feed the animals (Bean bag toss);
- Video - One of the students from Quambone PS, Brock, filmed a video at his farm to show our students what life is like on the farm during the drought.

Last Thursday afternoon the girls had the opportunity to video conference with the students from Quambone PS. When they asked the students what they wanted, the resounding, collective answer was "RAIN!" The children at Quambone do not want anything for themselves, they want feed to keep their animals and pets alive. I will be speaking with Principal from Quambone about how we best help them to meet this need.

Share our Space

Schools are the heart of our communities and offer a range of quality recreational and play facilities.

Communication at school

One of our strategic directions for the next three years is 'Our Community'. The purpose is to improve our communication systems to better engage with parents and the broader school community.

The community team has been working hard to collect feedback and to use the feedback in their planning. There have been multiple opportunities for parents to provide feedback including:

- Online surveys – 360 Customer Service Survey tool, Tell Them From Me;
- Meetings – Community Consultation meetings each term this year;
- Links in the newsletter to feedback mechanisms;
- Exit surveys at meetings.

In fact Tell Them from Me Survey is now open again and we welcome your feedback so we can keep improving.

We are focused on providing current, relevant information to parents in a timely manner. Some of the improvements we have made this year include:

- Streamlining and consistent formatting of notes home;
- Hard copies of all notes have been sent home consistently throughout the year;
- Development and trial of style guide for teachers when planning school activities and events;
- New school website, with upcoming events clearly listed on the homepage;
- Events on school website include an attachment if there is a permission note required, and a link to add the event to your calendar;
- Our newsletter is sent every even week of the term, and the front page lists a summary of upcoming events, and the notes sent home in the previous fortnight. It also lists assembly dates, and the days of regular school activities;
- All notes sent home to relevant grades as a hard copy, on our eNews app and available on the website.

I am reminded however that communication is only as good as the engagement of the person receiving the information. Communication requires two participants – the transmitter and the receiver. It is important that parents and community members engage with us, by checking their child's bag for notes home, reading the newsletter, and by checking the website and the app regularly.

If you are unsure about anything the school sends out, please contact us to clarify information. Our website, newsletter, and notes always include the school contact details, including phone number and email. Our front office is open from 8:30am – 3:15pm.

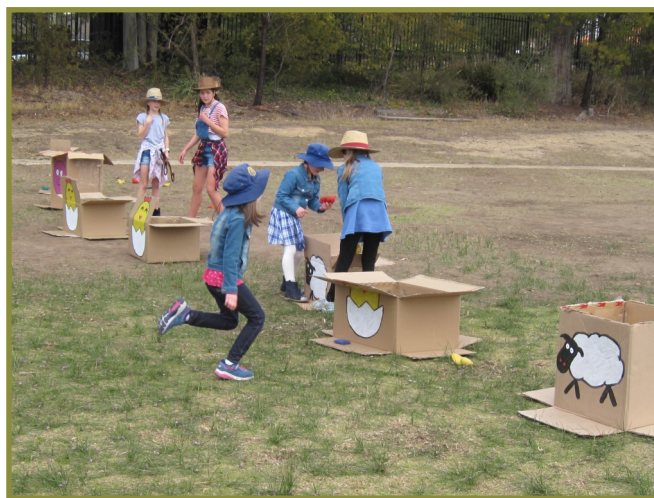

This is My Story

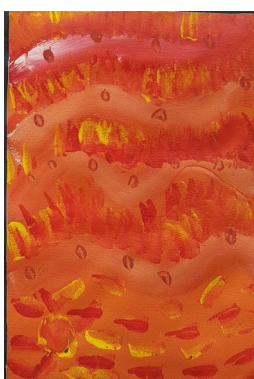

My home colour is a dark white. I made it with 3 parts white and 1/4 part black.

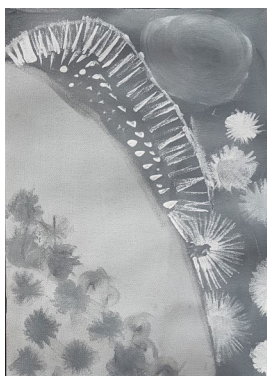
My home colour is the snow of New Zealand. The snow there is normally not plain white it has a dark tone to it. The reason I chose this colour is because almost all of my family is from there.

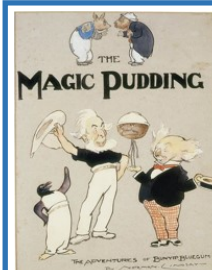

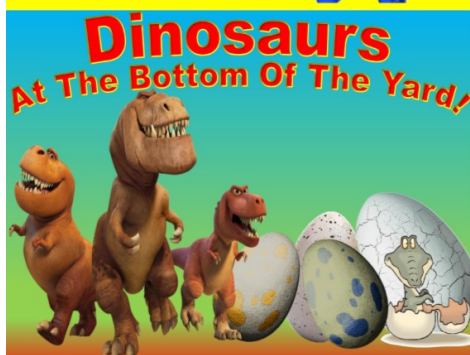
