Principal's Report

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Swimming Carnival

We were blessed with fine weather for our Swimming Carnival at Lawson Pool last Tuesday. I was impressed by not only the competitive spirit, but also the 'have a go' attitude of our students. Sportsmanship was definitely on display, and the students were safe and respectful throughout the day. Well done to all the competitors, and congratulations to the winning house – Pyne.

A big thankyou to the Stage 3 teachers who organised the carnival. It was a great job team!

Meet the Teacher Evening

A big thank you to all the parents who came along to our Meet the Teacher evening and BBQ. It was a great opportunity to find out what is happening at school, especially in your child's classroom.

A big thank you to Mr Earl, Mrs Jansons and the staff for organising and cooking the BBQ, and to all the staff for their effort and preparation for the evening. It was a positive event for our school community. A reminder that any students attending after school activities such as dancing remain the responsibility of parents and there is no teacher supervision. All children including siblings should be under the supervision of their parents.

A quick question was asked at the Meet the Teacher evening: Which time slot for Friday assemblies would you prefer – 11:30am or 2pm?

The response was overwhelmingly in favour of a 2pm assembly time. We will begin a trial of this time in Term 2. For the remainder of Term 1 our assembly times will remain at 11.30am.

Volunteer Induction

Thank you to all our helpers in the school who attended the Volunteer Induction last week. It covered a safety briefing & emergency procedures, sign in/out procedures, child protection, WWCC requirements, contact people, first aid, student supervision and duty of care. It is good to know that we can keep everyone safe in an emergency and that we have met all our Child Protection and Working with Children Check rules. It is important to sign in and sign out so we know exactly who is on our school site at any given time.

If you were unable to attend the induction please contact Mrs Frith and she will take through the key points before you start helping around the school.

If you are considering helping in the classroom or the school, as **parent volunteer** (parent or close relative) you must complete the Appendix 5 Declaration form and provide 100 points of proof identity to the front office. These documents should be provided prior to commencing volunteer work. The school then needs to complete their processes, with completed Appendix 5 forms and 100 points proof of identity documentation securely filed and our school register updated. Appendix 5 only needs to be completed once while ever you have children attending the school (unless circumstances change). These documents are auditable and must be current at all times. Please assist the office staff by completing these forms and providing 100 points proof of identity documentation.

Non-parent volunteers require a Working with Children Check, 100 points of proof of identity and completion of Appendix 11. Working with Children Checks can be applied for on the Roads and Maritime (RMS) website.

Principal's Report Continued...

Attendance

Attendance at school is expected every day. If your child is absent, we request that you send a note on your child's return to school explaining the absence.

If your child arrives late to school they are required to get a late note at the office.

Similarly, if you need to pick up your child early to attend an appointment, please go to the office to get an early leavers note. The office staff will then page your child to bring their bag to the office to meet you. Please remain in the office until your child arrives. This negates the need for you to go looking for your child if they are not in the classroom.

External Providers of Therapy Services

We will be updating our paperwork over the next few weeks. The key features are that parents must provide a written request to the school/principal for the service, therapists must also complete an induction process, and planning meetings with parents, school and therapists must occur and records kept. This must be done annually.

All therapists entering the school are at the principal's discretion. Disruption to learning, conflicts of interest and confidentiality must be considered when providing access for therapists. All parents of students currently accessing therapy services at school will be contacted in the next few weeks to update our records.

Notes home

Over the next week we will be sending home permission notes that must be completed each year. The permission notes include participation in child protection lessons, acceptable internet usage policy, and permission to publish name and photos of your child. We also ask permission for your child's details to be shared with online service providers. These service providers support our Reporting processes and includes Class Dojo, Literacy Planet and other learning tools. Please read and sign all relevant notes and return to the front office by **Friday 8th March**.

Clarifying Information

If you have a question regarding anything at school, please contact your child's class teacher in the first instance. If you require further information or clarification please contact one of the Assistant Principals (Mr Earl, Mrs Jansons, Mrs Bridges, Mrs Carter) or Mrs Frith.

Often simple problems can be solved with a conversation. Sometimes it can be tempting to take to social media when a phone call, email or conversation directly with school staff can clarify things quickly. Our newsletter, website and ENews app all provide the most current information.

Recently we have had some issues with lunch boxes in the playground. We are acutely aware that many parents buy new lunchboxes to start the new school year. It was recommended that students leave their lunchboxes in their bags if possible, or put them away when they finish eating.

There are 3 main reasons for this:

1. **Safety** – lunchboxes left in the main thoroughfares of the school (Quad) can be a trip hazard for students, staff and parent volunteers. Our school wide expectation of being safe includes putting items away or aside. Students who bring their lunchboxes to the Quad area are asked to place them under the silver seats when they have finished eating.
2. **Cockatoos** – our resident flock of cockatoos has become quite agile at opening lunchboxes left outside. They can open zippers and clips on lunchboxes. The cockatoos then scatter the food around the playground. If lunchboxes are put away then a major food source for the cockatoos will be eliminated.
3. **Respect** – another of our school wide expectations is met when students look after their own property. Some students reported items missing from lunchboxes and bags. Respecting our own personal property, by taking care of it, and acting responsibly is an important skill to learn. Respecting other people's property is also important.

Principal's Report Continued...

To clarify lunchboxes can be taken to the Quad area but should be placed to the edge of the area (eg. under the silver seats) during playtime to avoid trip hazards. Lunchboxes should be collected by students on their way to line up under the Big Top area at the end of each play session.

Parking and traffic around the school

Please be mindful of our neighbours to the school when parking before and after school. We have a new resident to our village whose driveway is regularly blocked each afternoon by cars parked across it. We acknowledge that parking is an ongoing issue, as is the traffic congestion. We ask that you check when parking that you are not parking illegally or across a resident's driveway.

This week we had visits from some BMCC Councillors to see for themselves the traffic and parking issues around the school.

PEDLAR'S FAIR

Friday 5th April

Time: 10.00am – 12.30pm

On Friday 5th April, the school will be holding a Pedlar's Fair and Parade to assist with fundraising for future focused learning. This will include new furniture for flexible learning spaces and technology. Parents, family and friends are warmly invited and a special welcome is extended to grandparents on the day.

Early Stage 1 & Stage 1 children dress up and bring a tray or basket of goods to sell. The students parade before an audience, displaying their wares (like pedlars). In the past, students have sold a range of items such as homemade crafts, food, second hand toys and books. Be as creative as you like! Items can be priced from 20c-\$2.

Stage 2 & Stage 3 children use their initiative and group work skills to develop a **stall or entertainment for the fair**. Some examples are busking, face painting, spiders, guessing competitions, raffles, carnival games and competitions. **Students will need to write their stall plan, people in their group and the equipment needed on paper and give it to Mrs Jansons or Mrs Curzon to book in a playground space for their stall and get their idea approved.**

Children and their families need to start thinking of ideas for the fair.

In addition, students will need money to exchange for 'tokens' to spend on the day. Students will be able to exchange their money for tokens each morning from 8.25am in April. Purchased tokens will be safely stored for students at school until the day of the fair. Tokens will also be able to be purchased during the fair.

We are looking forward to bringing our community together to create a memorable day!

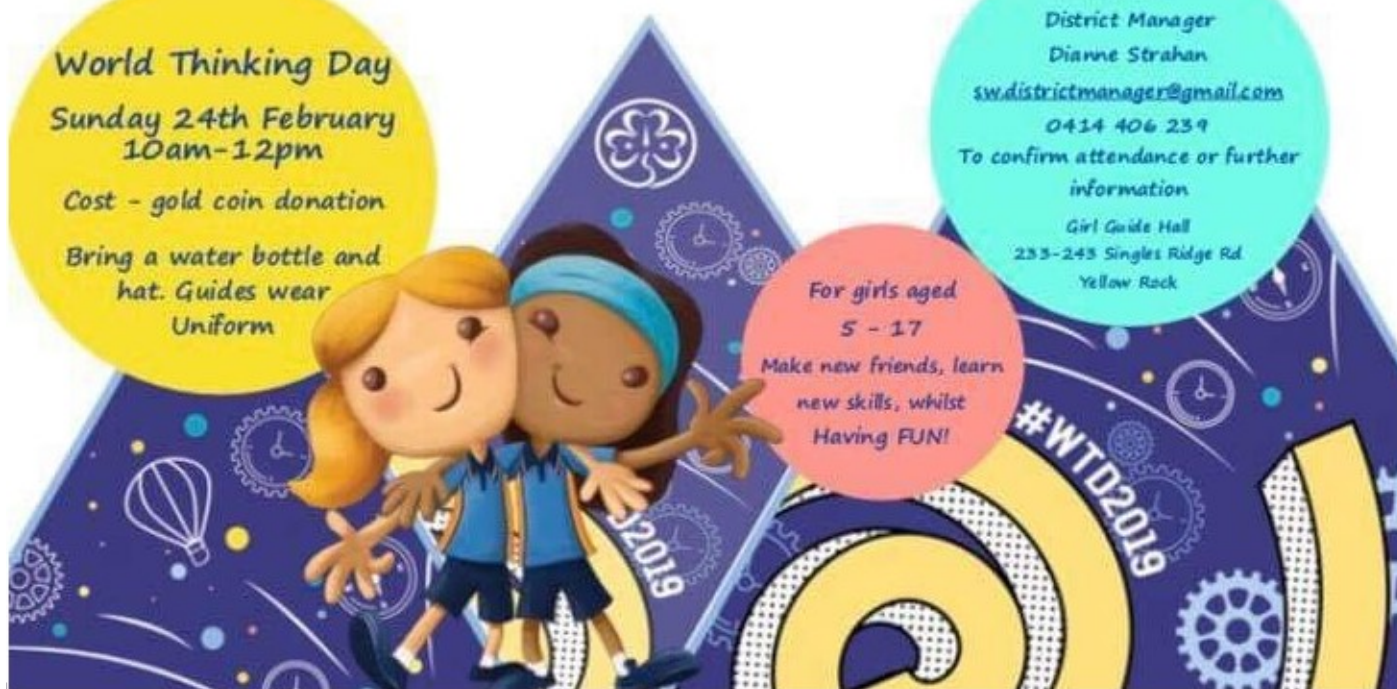
