Principal's Report

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

School Closed

This vacation period the school grounds are closed. We have been advised by School Infrastructure NSW that the **Share Our Space program** <u>WILL NOT</u> be operating at our school. Please do not come to the school grounds during the vacation period. FunKids will continue to operate.

Bus Travel - Opal Cards

Blue Mountains Transit recently contacted the school to request support in ensuring that all students catching the bus 'tap on' and 'tap off' using their Opal Card. Every week there are children catching the bus home who tell me that they:

- 'left their card at home;'
- 'lost it'
- 'mum's getting me a new one'

We also have some students getting on the bus with no Opal Card and no money.

It is important to understand that service delivery of buses to and from our school is based on bus usage and that usage is

determined by data collected from Opal Cards as they are tapped. Lack of perceived patronage on the school buses may lead to a reduced level of services provided to the school.

If your child/ren catch the bus, please assist us in ensuring that they have their Opal Card ready to travel. The Code of Conduct for School Bus Travel is attached in this newsletter. Please read through it with your child/ren and ensure they understand their responsibilities when catching the bus.



Bushfire Season

Bushfire season generally operates from 1st October to the 31st March. In preparation for the bushfire season we are currently checking that all our procedures are in place to keep everyone safe. Parents can assist in this process by ensuring you have our School Enews app on your smartphones. We will endeavour to ensure updates of our bushfire status are made regularly during any bushfire emergency. Downloading and checking the RFS 'Fires Near Me' app which is free for all smartphones also assists with getting the most up to date information. During Term 4 we will enact a bushfire drill to check all our systems are in place.

ATTENDANCE POLICY:

All parents have a responsibility to ensure that children attend school each day and to notify the school as soon as possible if their child is away. If your child is absent parents are required to provide the school with an absence note explaining why they were away. If your child is absent for 2 days or more (without notification from parents) the school will contact you to find out why they are absent and why the school was not notified. If your child is absent due to illness the school can request a medical certificate from the doctor.

Schools have a legal requirement to record student attendance. A significant change to the policy is the expectation that students who travel within Australia or overseas for a holiday do so during school holidays. If students are going on holidays during school time an Application for Extended Leave – Travel must be completed by parents before travelling with copies of the itinerary attached. This absence will now be counted towards a student's total absence and be recorded on your child's Semester reports. Please consider the impact on your child's learning before taking leave during school time. The Application for Extended Leave – Travel is available from the office. A Certificate of Extended Leave – Travel will be issued if the leave is approved. Please note that parents are responsible for supervision of children whilst on extended leave.

The Home School Liaison Officer regularly checks and monitors student attendance. If the attendance of your child drops below 80% then you may be contacted, as this is equivalent to missing a day per week of school. Missing school significantly impacts on consistency of instruction and consistency of social friendships. It always preferable for attendance to be above 90%.


Fundraising

Code of conduct for school students on buses

It is every student's responsibility to behave in a manner that ensures the safety and comfort of passengers and drivers. This includes:

Behaviour on buses

- Use appropriate language not offensive or racist language
- Fighting, spitting, feet on seats, throwing things in or from the bus is not permitted
- No eating or drinking (other than water) unless for medical reasons or the bus operator gives written permission.
- Offer seats to adults including people with a disability, elderly or expectant mothers
- Do not push or shove other people
- Do not bully or harass other passengers or the driver
- Avoid attracting the attention of the driver except in the case of emergency
- Do not play music at such volume that it may distract the bus driver or other passengers.

Safety on and near buses

- Obey reasonable directions from the driver (e.g. where to sit or to remain in the bus)
- Remain in your seat do not move around the bus unnecessarily
- If standing, remain behind the front passenger seat and keep a secure hand hold at all times
- Keep bags and other items clear of the aisle
- Do not allow any part of your body to protrude out of the bus at any time
- Wait for the bus in a quiet and orderly manner including at bus interchanges
- Stand away from the roadside until the bus comes to a complete stop
- Allow other passengers to leave the bus before stepping onto the bus in a single line
- Wait until the bus stops before moving to get off the bus at your designated stop
- Cross the road where and when it's safe to do so, use crossings/traffic lights where available.

Legal considerations on buses

- Wear the seat belt properly adjusted and fastened, if one is available
- Obey the law that bans smoking on buses
- Ensure that buses are not vandalised report any damage, e.g. graffiti and window etching, to the driver
- Do not interfere with bus property, equipment and signage
- Do not leave rubbish on the bus, or at bus stops or interchanges.

Using bus passes

- Show travel passes or tickets to the driver on boarding and to Authorised Revenue Protection Officers, NSW
- Police Officers or bus company representative when requested
- Use the travel pass only for its intended purpose do not lend your pass to other students or borrow a pass from them
- Swipe or 'dip' passes in ticket readers if available when boarding
- If issued with a School Opal card, always tap on when boarding and tap off when leaving the bus.

Disobeying these rules may lead to the withdrawal of bus travel passes, banning students from travelling on buses and/or police prosecution and court action.

FPS Return and Earn Fundraiser

What you need to do:

- 1. Collect eligible bottles- Every eligible bottle, can or carton you return through Return and Earn is worth a refund of 10 cents.
- 2. Take containers to a return and earn drop off centre (Containers need to be empty, uncrushed, unbroken, and have the original label intact)
- 3. You have different payout options to receive this refund, we are using the Retail Voucher option. Click on *Retail Voucher*, this will print out a retail voucher for the full refund amount.
- 4. Place your voucher/docket in an envelope with the student's name and class on it.
- 5. Put the envelope in the box located in the office.

What we will do:

- 1. Weekly my team and I will collect the retail vouchers and document who has brought in vouchers and how much they are worth.
- 2. We will tally the results, a graph will be up for all to see near the office.
- 3. A staff member will take the retail vouchers and cash them in. All money raised will go directly into the garden and kitchen.
- 4. The class that raises the most money by the last week of term 4 will receive a free morning tea.






Faulconbridge Public School Senior Boys Dominate Mountains Futsal Gala Day



UNIFORM RETURNS POLICY

Rationale:

Faulconbridge Public School currently sources its uniform articles from a number of suppliers. Every effort is made to order quality articles and the school should not be held responsible for manufacturing defects.

Aim:

- To provide clear guidelines and equal access to all the members of the school community regarding returns and exchanges at the uniform shop.
- One standard policy has been set with regard to defective or unsatisfactory items that require a return or exchange.

Guidelines:

- Articles that are unsatisfactory due to a manufacturer defect and are returned to the uniform shop (with proof of purchase) within 6 months after they have been worn, laundered and / or used will be replaced with an alternate item.
- Articles that are considered unsatisfactory by the purchaser after more than 6 months following purchase will not be accepted for return by the uniform shop. These may be returned to the supplier for determination on repair or replacement by the purchaser if desired.
- Articles that are unsatisfactory due to incorrect sizing that are returned to the uniform shop
 within 14 days of purchase (with proof of purchase) in the same condition as initial receipt (ie.
 Re-saleable) will be exchanged for the correct size.
- Articles that are unsatisfactory due to incorrect sizing that are returned to the uniform shop and have been worn, laundered and/ or used cannot be refunded or replaced.
- Due to Health and Safety Regulations hats cannot be exchanged or refunded after purchase.Please choose size carefully.

The above-mentioned policy does not affect your rights under Australian Consumer Law.

A sales receipt will be offered as a SMS or email on every purchase. This receipt will be required for all returns or exchanges.


