Attendance Term 4

Thank you to everyone who has supported their children to attend school every day. Our daily attendance this week has improved on previous weeks. Attendance at school has been demonstrated to be a significant factor in students learning outcomes and wellbeing. Establishing and maintaining regular routines also assist students to develop their independence as they get older. All students in Kindergarten to Year 11 are required to attend school until Wednesday 16 December, the last day of teaching for 2020. Prior to this date, students in all year groups are engaged in meaningful work based on the curriculum and syllabus requirements. We expect to see every student at school every day. If there is an absence, please send a note with your child on the day they return to school or email the school. Absences for sick of 3 days or more should be covered by a medical certificate, where possible.

If parents are seeking permission for their child to be absent from school for a period of more than 10 days an Extended Leave application should be completed at least one week prior to the planned absence.

Traffic congestion

Please be aware of the traffic and parking restrictions in the streets around the school. It has been brought to my attention that some parents are parking illegally ignoring traffic signs and parking across driveways. Please be respectful of our neighbours and their right to access their own properties. In the interests of safety please adhere to the signposted parking spaces, particularly in Meeks Crescent. It is a narrow winding street at the Grose Rd end and if cars are parked on both sides of the street it impedes traffic flow. I would hate for there to be an accident where a student or parent was injured due to people not obeying the road rules and parking restrictions.

Bicycle Safety

Students under the age of 10 should not be riding to and from school unless they are under the supervision of an adult.

Footpaths

Since 23 July 2018, children under 16 years of age are allowed to ride on a footpath (increased from children under 12 years of age). Allowing children under the age of 16 on the footpath will help keep them safe until they have the skills, decision making and knowledge of the rules to ride safely on the road.

An adult rider who is supervising a bicycle rider under 16 may also ride with the young rider on the footpath. Children aged 16 or 17 can ride on the footpath, when accompanied by a child under 16 and a supervising adult.

When riding on a footpath, riders must keep left and give way to pedestrians.

Helmets

The helmet laws for cyclists of all ages in NSW help prevent head injuries and brain damage from falls and crashes. The Road Rules state that a bicycle rider on roads and road-related areas must wear an approved bicycle helmet securely fitted and fastened. This applies to all bicycle riders, regardless of age, including children on bicycles with training wheels and any child being carried as a passenger on a bike or in a bicycle trailer.

Australia values teachers much more than they know

The campaign kicks off with the launch of a new report that highlights the important link between teachers feeling valued and positive outcomes for students.

The Spotlight report, *Teaching: A valued profession,* reveals that although the community supports teachers, they are much more circumspect about feeling valued. Ensuring teachers feel valued in society and are satisfied with their jobs is integral to teachers having positive attitudes about their work and ability to influence student achievement. They are more likely to engage in continuous professional development, improve confidence and satisfaction, and remain in the profession.

The report highlights a 2019 Monash University study which found that while 82 per cent of the public felt teachers were respected and 93 per cent of the public felt that teachers were trusted, only 29 per cent of teachers felt that the Australian public appreciated them. Similarly, the 2018 OECD Teaching and Learning International Survey (TALIS) shows only 45 per cent of Australian teachers in lower secondary schools believe that the teaching profession is valued by society.

The difference between what the public thinks and what teachers think comes down to several factors, including the negative portrayals of teaching that dominate the media. For example, an analysis of newspaper headlines and articles between April 2017 and March 2018 in Queensland, found that over half of the 270 relevant articles expressed a negative attitude toward the teaching profession, while only 31 per cent were positive and 14 per cent were neutral.

"This year has shown us just how agile, committed and dedicated our teachers can be in the face of tremendous stress and upheaval," AITSL CEO Mark Grant said.

"Now, more than at any time, we have the opportunity to better understand what is involved in successful teaching, and to recognise the fundamental value that teachers provide to the community. As we approach World Teachers' Day in 2020 this report is an important reminder of the incredible value that the community sees in our teachers. In a year unlike any other let's join together to celebrate our amazing teachers," Mark Grant said.

"World Teachers' Day on 30 October is the perfect opportunity to show our teachers how much we value them, we support them, and we acknowledge the brilliant work they do every day to advance the learning lives of students across Australia," Mark Grant said.

Faulconbridge Station Upgrade

Project update

October 2020

Upcoming work in October

Construction on the Faulconbridge Station Upgrade is progressing well, with footpath upgrade, lift shaft excavation and toilet upgrade work continuing thoughout September. Construction activities in October will include:

- upgrading the ramp between the footbridge and Railway Avenue commuter car park
- concreting work and installing steel structures for the two lifts
- installing electrical services and concrete work on the platforms
- installing new power supply service to the station (connection with services on Sir Henry Parade)
- upgrading the bathrooms and station waiting room on the platform.

Equipment to be used during this work will include excavators, compactors, mobile cranes, elevated work platforms, delivery and concrete trucks, power and hand held tools.

Temporary traffic changes – Sir Henry Parade

From Monday 26 October 2020 until late November 2020 between 7am and 6pm there will be five shifts of work to upgrade the power supply to the station (weather permitting). Work during the day involves creating a trench across Sir Henry Parade in sections to install underground power supply services and restore the road surface following.

To maintain the safety of our workers and the community, there will be a temporary single lane closure operating under the direction of traffic controllers between **7am and 6pm**, between Monday and Friday. Signage will also be in place to help pedestrians and motorists with the temporary traffic and access changes. Further notifications will be provided should there be any disruptions to power.

Temporary traffic changes – Great Western Highway

Throughout our work, there may be occasional temporary traffic changes at **Great Western Highway near Faulconbridge Station, including single lane road closures** to accommodate large vehicles undertaking construction work and to enable concrete work at the Great Western Highway lift work area.

Subject to approval, from October until end of the year, we will receive intermittent delivery of steel from a large delivery truck using the Great Western Highway (westbound) between **Monday and Friday** from **10am and 2pm**. Traffic control and signage will be in place to help pedestrians and motorists with the temporary traffic changes.

Temporary access changes – between footbridge and commuter car park

Work continues in October, to upgrade the ramp between the footbridge and Railway Avenue commuter car park. This includes installing a retaining wall, earthwork and construction of the new concrete footpath/ramp. Pedestrian and vehicle access will be maintained at all times. Directional signage will be in place to help pedestrians and motorists with these temporary changes.

Toilet reopens and waiting room closure

On **Monday 12 October 2020**, the former male toilet on the platform will reopen as a family accessible toilet for customers. The station waiting room and former female toilet will then close for refurbishment and are expected to reopen in December 2020.

Standard construction hours

Our construction hours are now 7am to 6pm every day, including public holidays.

We understand extending construction hours to weekends and public holidays may cause disruption for the community and all efforts will be made to minimise impacts where possible and ensure strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management are adhered to.

The Department of Education Compliance & Safety team is conducting state-wide inspections as part of the Asbestos Resurvey Program. Round 1 of this program is scheduled for October 2020 and involves a total of 102 schools across NSW.

The health, safety, and well-being of the school and the local community is our highest priority. Please be assured these inspections will not pose a risk to the local community.

The community will be notified if an area requires attention or remediation.

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now apply online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental

responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out

from January 2021.
