

Principal's Report

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

COVID-19 restrictions Phase 3 continues

At the time of writing this newsletter the current Phase 3 restrictions for schools remain in place and will continue into Term 3. This includes parents continuing to drop off and pick up children at the gate, and not coming onto the school site without a prior appointment. Given the outbreaks that are currently occurring in Victoria, I would appreciate everyone in the school community complying with this restriction until otherwise advised.

There has been no further information regarding Stage 3 camp. We are still hopeful that it will go ahead, however we may need to cancel if restrictions are not lifted. Equally, P&C activities such as Blackboard Café and Twilight Markets are on hold awaiting further advice.

I will keep the community updated as to the restrictions as I receive further advice.

Use of technology at school

COVID-19 has certainly increased our use of technology across the school for students, staff and parents. With this in mind, it is timely as we move into Term 3 to revisit our 'Internet Acceptable Use Policy'. Teachers will be revising the rules around responsible use of technology with all students to ensure that we all stay safe online.

The internet is a wonderful resource that adds another dimension to learning. The internet offers facilities that can enhance students' learning opportunities and outcomes in all key learning areas. While the internet possesses vast stores of information and educational resources, there are also undesirable aspects of the internet including:

- Socially and culturally inappropriate material
- Offensive material
- Gambling sites
- Misinformation

The NSW Department of Education and Communities provides the internet service free of charge to schools. In order to maintain a safe and appropriate environment for students, all internet access at school is filtered automatically by the service provider to prevent known undesirable sites from being accessed. In addition to the filter, access is given under teacher supervision, which may not always be direct.

Both parents and teachers need to guide and encourage children to be responsible users of the Internet by making them aware of the rules of online behaviour and access privileges. The observation of these rules will help make the Internet a magnificent resource for children's learning.

Student Acceptable Use of the Internet Agreement

I will:

- Use the Internet for research, and for learning purposes related to the school curriculum
- Press STOP and BACK button immediately if I see any strange or inappropriate material
- Inform an adult if I find something inappropriate or that makes me uncomfortable
- Use information found on the Internet to take notes, as part of my overall research
- Acknowledge information used from the Internet and follow copyright rules



Principal's Report cont'd

- · Use e-mail only when approved by my teacher for learning, being polite and using acceptable language
- Have my teacher edit my e-mails before sending them
- Check with the teacher before printing or saving any material, downloading images or games
- Only use the Internet with teacher supervision
- No use of internet on personal mobile phones at school

I will not:

- Attempt to access inappropriate material
- Look at inappropriate material if Ifind it by accident
- Pass on information about inappropriate material to other students
- Respond to mean, abusive or intrusive messages
- Send inappropriate messages
- Give out my own or anyone else's phone number, home address or e-mail address
- Hand in someone else's work from the Internet
- Download, order or subscribe to anything online
- Use chat rooms
- Arrange a face-to-face meeting without permission
- Use other people's passwords, or give their password to another person
- Change school computer settings in any way

At the beginning of next term, we have invited the Police Youth Liaison Officer, Constable Lyndall Hatton, to come our school to speak to our students in Stage 2 and Stage 3 about responsible technology use.

Years 3 – 4 (ages 8 – 9) Students will learn about how the internet is used, why unidentifiable usernames and passwords are essential to maintaining privacy and security and why adult supervision and permission is important before signing up to apps and websites. There will be conversations around online gaming, respectful language and talking to people online. Along with this, the session will also cover safe searching and what help is available.

Years 5 – 6 (ages 10 – 11) Students in this age group will have a session building on concepts of technology and online safety. Discussions will be held around usernames, passwords and privacy settings when using websites and apps. Further to this, students will learn about true and false information, safe searching and staying safe while using instant messaging. The presenter will also speak about sharing images or videos and what information can be gathered from these. Online gaming, staying safe when playing online games and what help is available to students to support them staying safe online will also be discussed.

Student Reports

Our teachers have been working hard over the last couple of weeks since students returned to assess learning and prepare reports. Reports have been sent home today. With your child's report is information about how to book a phone interview with the class teacher in Week 1 next term. Please note that each phone interview has been given a 10minute time slot. The interview is intended to discuss your child's progress and the contents of the report. If you feel you need a longer discussion, please contact your child's teacher and arrange a mutually convenient time for a longer interview.

A reminder that students return to school on Tuesday 21st July. Monday 20th July is Staff Development Day. Teachers and staff will be participating in professional learning on that day.

Dear Parents and Caregivers,


