#### **Principal's Report**

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

#### Where did our red hats go?

There may be some members of our community who are wondering what happened to the red hats that some students used to wear at school. The red hats had been used to identify students with health issues on the playground. In an effort to update our procedures in line with DoE policy, we have now ceased use of the red hat.

This decision was not taken lightly, and all parents of the students affected by the change were consulted. The students themselves were also consulted to gather their opinions. Results for both consultations were mixed but leant towards phasing out the red hats. We therefore proceeded to align our school procedures to the DoE policies. We implemented the change at the beginning of 2021 school year.

On Staff Development Day, staff received professional learning requiring teachers to have an in-depth look at each of our students who have emergency response/anaphylaxis plans. The intention was that all students are known, valued and cared for, hence we must know our students with health care needs. Each term staff receive refresher training on knowing the students and their health care needs.

In the early weeks of term 1, all students who previously wore a red hat had their parents contacted via phone by Mrs Jansons in her LST Coordinator role. Parents were offered a blue hat for their child, paid for by the school. Parents were assured that other measures were in place to keep students safe at school including the professional learning on staff development day. Classroom teachers have health care plans accessible in the classroom. All teachers carry photos of these students in their playground bags along with the required health care response. Health care information for these students is also accessible to teachers in the hall, library and music room. The health care plans have been updated and are displayed in the sick bay in accordance with WHS policy.

Student privacy has been considered at every step and the hat changeover was completed in a low-key manner away from other students and community members. For this reason, we had not communicated the change to the broader school community earlier.

#### **Communication, Complaints and Enquiries**

Sometimes it may seem that a change has happened, and you have no information about it. We try wherever possible to ensure clear communication with community through the:

- School website;
- School newsletter;
- School Enews App;
- Paper copies of notes requiring permission or payment;
- Most teachers using class dojo for class specific messages.

If you are unsure about something, please ask us. Often a simple conversation can clarify an issue, rather than moving to more formal complaint procedures.

The annual school Cross Country was held last Friday. We can never predict the weather for these carnivals, whether it be cold or hot on the day, but we were blessed with a beautiful day. A big thank you to Mr Smith for his organisation of this event. The top runners in years 3-6 will represent Faulconbridge at the Blue Mountains Zone PSSA carnival on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> May.

#### **ANZAC** Day.

The school's commemorative ANZAC assembly was held last Friday morning before the Cross Country event. Thank you to Mrs Jansons for organising this significant event, the student leadership team for running the assembly and to the students, staff and parents who observed this solemn occasion respectfully.

#### 2021 NAPLAN Tests:

Students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will sit for the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) in Weeks 4. I would like students, family and friends to remember that these tests are unable to measure all of what it is that makes each student the valued person they are. The NAPLAN tests results give some very specific information about each student, but cannot say everything there is to say about who they are and what they have achieved.

The teachers at Faulconbridge ensure students are familiar with the test format and go above and beyond to provide appropriate support and guidance both leading up to and during the tests. We reassure students that NAPLAN is an opportunity to demonstrate skills they have learnt over time through the school curriculum and we try our very best to reduce anxiety by treating NAPLAN test days as just another event on the school calendar. My main wish is for students to approach the tests with confidence and to try their best on the day.

This year we have elected to do most of the NAPLAN tests online. All students have had an opportunity to do a practice test online. Please note that the Year 3 Writing test will be pen and paper, not online.

The NAPLAN tests will be conducted in week 4, from 11-14 May, 2017.

#### Food at school

There are the odd occasions when a student does not bring lunch to school. This can be for a variety of reasons. We want to ensure every child has something to eat during the day. Having enough food and energy helps your child to do their best learning at school. We have a procedure to ensure that children have something to eat if they have not brought their lunch to school.

If your child does not have food at school, we will give them a simple Vegemite sandwich at lunch time and ensure they have some water at the bubbler. We will let you know if we have provided a sandwich for your child via a note home. The note will have a tear off slip to be returned to the office which acknowledges that you are aware of the situation.

This is just another step in ensuring the wellbeing of all our students.


## 10 Questions with Mrs Hawkins

The NSW Premier's Sporting Challenge (PSC) was developed and implemented in 2008 to support the NSW State Plan for reducing overweight and obesity in childhood. Since 2008, the PSC has evolved to include a suite of programs aimed at addressing the Premier's Priorities for Tackling Childhood Obesity and meeting the recommendations of the Auditor General's Report on Physical Activity in NSW Government Primary Schools.

The flagship program of the PSC is a 10-week physical activity challenge for students in public schools. The overarching objective of the Challenge is to get more students more active, more often. With the goal of encouraging all students to participate in at least 60 minutes of physical activity every day.

All students in Years 3 to 6 will have the opportunity to participate in this challenge in the coming weeks. Dates are still to be confirmed.





## **Healthy Lunch Box recipe**

## Zucchini muffins.



#### Ingredients

- 2 zucchinis, grated & liquid squeezed out
- 1 carrot, grated
- 125g tin com kernels, drained
- 1 small red onion, finely diced
- 1 cup baby spinach leaves, chopped
- 1 cup wholemeal self-raising flour 6 eggs, beaten
- 1 cup reduced-fat tasty cheese, arated

#### Method

Preheat oven to 180°C. Line a 12-hole muffin tin with muffin liners.

Heat a non-stick frypan over medium heat and cook the onion until translucent. Allow to cool.

Place all ingredients into a large mixing bowl and mixuntil well combined.

Divide the mixture between the 12 muffin liners. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until muffins are golden and a skewer comes out clean.
