## Principal's Report

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

### National Volunteers Week "Recognise. Reconnnect. Reimagine."

Next week, May 17 -23 is an opportunity to recognise the contribution volunteers make to our school and our students. This annual celebration acknowledges the generous contribution of our nation's volunteers. On behalf of the families, students and staff of Faulconbridge Public School, I want to thank those who give their time so generously. I know your time is valuable, and your willingness to contribute some of that valuable time to Faulconbridge Public School shows your commitment to the wellbeing of your child and all of our students.

The contributions you have made by working in the P&C, Blackboard Café, garden, uniform shop, as reading helpers and classroom helpers for example, have really made a difference in our students' educational experience this year.

As you know, students, staff and parents/caregivers here at Faulconbridge enjoy a warm, caring community that fosters the highest standards of academic, social and emotional growth. The efforts of volunteers like you are a vital part of that community.

## **KINDERGARTEN 2022**

Incredibly, it is already time to begin planning for 2022, especially for Kindergarten. Our transition program will begin next term. If you live in our local area and have a child ready to start school in 2022, I would encourage you to enrol your child as soon as possible. We have several families wishing to enrol their children who live beyond our local area, and it is important that the school has an accurate gauge of our local enrolment before accepting any students from outside our local area. Our transition program will begin with a parent information evening early in term 3.

Faulconbridge Public School prides itself on delivering quality programs to students in a warm, caring learning environment. Our teachers are professional, caring and committed to teaching students a broad and balanced curriculum across the key learning areas (KLAs). We also pride ourselves on catering for the individual learning needs of all children. If your child is turning five before 31 July 2021, they can enrol at Faulconbridge Public School for 2022. You can now begin the enrolment process online. There is a link to the online enrolment on the school website under the enrolment tab.

Alternatively, please collect an enrolment form from the office and return as soon as possible. Proof of age for your child will be required. If you know someone who is planning to send their child to school next year, please ask them to contact the school and begin the enrolment process.

## ATTENDANCE POLICY

The Department of Education has an Attendance Policy. This policy highlights the importance of students attending each school day. Students who are frequently absent or are late for school miss vital learning experiences that may affect their educational, social and emotional wellbeing. All parents and caregivers have a responsibility to ensure that children attend school each day and to notify the school as soon as possible if their child is away.

If your child is absent you are required to provide the school with an **absence note** explaining why they were away. Please ensure that a **written letter** is provided upon your child's return to school. Schools have a legal requirement to record student attendance.

Currently approximately 10% of students have an attendance of <85%. This means they have missed at least 10 days (2 weeks) of learning already this year. For students whose attendance has fallen < 80% this means they are missing at least 1 day per week of school. When this happens, it is difficult for students to maintain positive social friendships and continuity of learning. I would encourage all parents to actively encourage attendance at school every day. I will be sending letters home next week to parents whose child's attendance is beginning to cause concern.



## Principal's Report cont'd

### FAMILY COURT ORDERS OR APPREHENDED VIOLENCE ORDERS

Sadly, sometimes relationships break down and the court makes orders that change the contact parents can have with their children or the role they play in making decisions about their children's education. These can be Family Court Orders or Apprehended Violence Orders. If this happens it is important that you provide the school with a copy of any court orders that could impact on your child's education.

In the absence of any notification to the contrary, the school will assume that both parents continue to retain a shared and equal parental responsibility for their children and should be involved in making any decisions regarding their children's education. This means that the school will recognise that each parent has equal duties, obligations, responsibilities and opportunities in relation to matters involving the school.

Fundamental principles underpinning the Department's response to family law matters that impact on the school:

- School is not the place for family disputes to be resolved. Nor should school staff be asked to resolve such issues.
- For children who are facing difficult family circumstances, school should be a safe haven into which family problems do not intrude.

If any changes occur in your family relationships which have the potential to impact on the relationship between the school and your family, please advise the school immediately and provide a copy of any court orders that may be obtained. These orders will be stored securely and only accessed by staff who need to see them in order to plan for your children's learning and support and related issues.

#### COMMUNICATION WITH TEACHERS

There are several options for contacting your child's teacher, including phone, email to the school email address and interviews. If you need to speak with the teacher, it is often best to organise an interview time where the teacher can give you their full attention. Teachers will endeavour to respond to messages as soon as they are able, usually within 24-48hours.

<u>ClassDojo</u> is another way to communicate with teachers. Most classes use the app to connect teachers, parents, and students. It is used to share photos, videos, and messages throughout the school day. All teachers who use Class Dojo will be applying the Quiet Hours function to the app. Quiet Hours will occur each school day from 5pm until 8am the following morning and on weekends.

If you contact your child's teacher during this time, you will receive a notification explaining that the message will be received by your child's teacher once the allocated quiet hours have ended.

### STAGE 3 CAMP

Mrs Hawkins, Mr Cleary, Miss Parker and Mrs Curzon took our Stage 3 students to camp at Milsons Island for the whole of Week 3. All reports from camp were that it was a great week, and an opportunity for students to challenge themselves in a range of activities. A huge thank you to our wonderful staff who give up their time from family to give our students such a great opportunity.

### **VOLUNTEERS AND VISITORS**

While restrictions have relaxed it is important to remain vigilant to COVID-19. A reminder to everyone to continue to use the Service NSW QR code when coming into school. Visitors and volunteers should also sign in at the office before proceeding to the classroom, garden, or other activity. We continue to practice hand hygiene with students and additional cleaning is still occurring.

If you are on the school site to collect your child for an appointment, or deliver a forgotten item such as a library bag, we ask that you come to the office. We will call your child to meet you at the office or to collect the forgotten item. It is important that we know who is on the school site and for what purpose. This protocol is in place to keep all students safe as part of our child protection procedures and emergency management.



## Principal's Report cont'd

### PARENT AFTERNOON PICK UP

It is great to see so many parents coming back into school to pick up their children. A reminder that after the bell you need to leave the school grounds with your children.

Recently, some children have been playing in areas of the school that are not normally play spaces during the school day while parents chat. The rules about play do not change after the bell has gone. The school has a reasonable duty of care whilst students are on the premises during the hours when the school is open for attendance. Parents have a responsibility to collect their children from school and move off the school site. I have spoken to all the students about this matter during the week. There are plenty of local parks where parents can supervise children while they play after school. I would appreciate all parents cooperating in this matter.
