Term 4 online learning will commence on Tuesday 5 October, as Monday 4 October is a public holiday.

Staggered Return to School Plan

As you may be aware the NSW Premier, Gladys Berejiklian, in conjunction with the NSW Department of Education and NSW Health, announced on Friday 27 August, a staggered return to school plan for term 4. The plan is for some students to start to return to school on Monday 25 October (Term 4, Week 4), as outlined below.

- From Monday 25 October (Term 4, Week 4), select cohorts under stay-at-home rules starting with students in Kindergarten and Year 1 will return to face-to-face learning under Level 3 plus COVID-safe settings, as long as community transmission and vaccination rate requirements have been met.
- From Monday 1 November (Term 4, Week 5), students in Years 2 and 6 will return to face-to-face learning under Level 3 plus COVID-safe settings, as long as community transmission and vaccination rate requirements have been met.
- From Monday 8 November (Term 4, Week 6), students in Years 3, 4 and 5 will return to face-to-face learning under Level 3 plus COVID-safe settings, as long as community transmission and vaccination rate requirements have been met.

Further information will be sent to all Faulconbridge families, early term 4 regarding the guidelines around the return to school procedures.

In the meantime, the Department of Education continues to ask for parent support with home learning and strongly urge all parents/carers to keep their children at home to participate in home learning. Schools will remain open for parents who are essential workers and are required to send their children to school.

Construction Work

Our school has recently received correspondence from Blue Mountains City Council about construction works near our school:

Construction of Kerb Ramp Faulconbridge Public School

Blue Mountains City Council has been successful in receiving funding to construct a new kerb ramp in the vicinity of Faulconbridge Public School. The School Zone Infrastructure sub - program is part of the \$540 million Federal Stimulus NSW Road Safety Program. The aim of the program is to deliver improvements to pedestrian and cycling facilities to better connect children and their parents and carers to their schools.

Council has identified the need for a new kerb ramp on the corner of Grose Road and Meeks Crescent. The construction works are due to commence on Wednesday 22nd September and concluding on Friday 24th September 2021.

This construction has been timed to coincide with school holidays, weather permitting.

To ensure work zones are safe, traffic and pedestrian management may be implemented during the works. Temporary fencing may also be installed as required. Please follow the signs and directions from traffic controllers. While every effort will be made to reduce the impact to the school, Council is aware that temporary inconvenience may be caused during construction. Pedestrian access to the school should still be available for those that need to access the school at this time. These works may also generate an increase in noise at times.

Council appreciates your cooperation and understanding while this project is being implemented and trust the outcome will be beneficial to the school community.


