






KG's amazing sunflower artwork that they created for Grandparent's Day and some of their amazing moves during dance lessons!



Nutrition Snippet

BALSAMIC BAKED VEG



Serves: 4

Ingredients:

- 2 carrots, peeled, cut into chunks
- 1 medium sweet potato, peeled, cut into
- 1/2 butternut pumpkin, peeled, cut into chunks
- 4 medium potatoes, cut into chunks
- 4 cloves garlic, peeled
- 1/4 cup water
- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 2 tbsp balsamic vinegar
- 1/2 tbsp honey
- 1 cup baby spinach

Method:

Preheat oven to 150°C /130°C fan forced.

Place all of the vegetables (except the baby spinach) in a roasting pan along with the aarlic.

Combine the water, olive oil, balsamic vinegar and honey in a jug and drizzle over all of the vegetables.

Bake for 45 minutes or soft and until golden. Toss through the baby spinach

Tip:

Mix through a tin of drained chickpeas for added protein.


